STEP 1

Put a Plan Together by discussing these questions with your family, friends, or household to start your emergency plan:

- 1. How will I receive emergency alerts and warnings?
- 2. What is my shelter plan?
- 3. What is my evacuation route?
- 4. What is my family/household communication plan?
- 5. Do I need to update my emergency preparedness kit?
 - Water, Non-perishable food, Medications, Medical Equipment, First Aid Kit, Battery powered or hand crank radio, Flashlight, Dust mask, Personal Hygiene Items, Pet Supplies, Toilet Paper, Identification & Important Items, Small Bills, Clothes, Extra Batteries, Extra Batteries.
